Academic Elective: PLTW



Project Lead The Way – focuses on aerospace/engineering technology with certifications and standards. Students use laboratory investigation, scientific research, and problem solving to test new technologies and find real world solutions. Semester 1 – students apply the concepts of physics, chemistry and nanotechnology to STEM activities and projects. Semester 2 – students play the role of medical detectives as they analyze genetic testing results to diagnose disease and study DNA.

Performing Arts Elective: Band

Band - Students develop foundational instrumental technique, foundational music literacy, and aesthetic musical awareness through rehearsal, performance, and study of high-quality band literature. These are some of the instruments used in Band:

- Woodwind: Flute, oboe, clarinet, bassoon, clarinet, and saxophone.
- Brass: Tuba, trombone, trumpet, Euphonium, trumpet, and French horn.
